



## Visitor Guide

Thank you for coming to visit us at Lymm Historic Transport Day. This is an event spread across the whole village of Lymm and throughout the whole day. This information pack is therefore designed to ensure that you maximise your experience with us and get the most from your time. ### **ABOUT**

Lymm Historic Transport Day is an entirely volunteer run, community event, the profits of which are donated to local charities and causes. We have over 400 classic cars, scooters, vintage bicycles, steam engines, old canal boats, model railways and heaps of attractions for children and adults alike! We've been named by the Warrington Guardian as one of the top things to do in the area over summer! ### **GETTING HERE**

If you're local to Lymm then we recommend leaving the car at home and walking into the village. Several roads through the village will be closed from 10am - 11:15am and parking will be difficult. If you're coming from out of town then Lymm is reached from Jct 20 on the M6 or Jcts 7 and 9 on the M56.

### **PARKING**

Please head to our Visitor Parking on **Crouchley Lane, WA13 0AS**. This is the large field adjacent to the road, and access to it is underneath the stone archway. From here it is a ten minute stroll into the village (0.5 miles) or you can hop onto a vintage shuttle bus which will drop you in the village centre. Parking is free, but you need to purchase a ticket (there is a ticket table at the Car Park) to the event and show the ticket in order to get onto a bus. The bus stop is in the Lymm Rugby Club car park. We do ask for an extra £1 supplement for the shuttle bus, which will be added onto the ticket price at the car park.

**Disabled Parking** is available on the May Queen Field, but there are only half a dozen spaces available and these are offered on a first come, first served basis. We do also have mobility scooters available for the day, in return for a donation to the Warrington Disability Partnership. You can find these scooters on the field next to the disabled parking.

## TICKETS

You need only one ticket in order to access the buses and all the venues across the village. This will be a wristband that you should keep on - people without wristbands cannot gain entry to the Village Hall, Maple Lodge or the May Queen Field. Tickets cost £6 for an adult (15yrs+), £3 for a child and £15 for a family ticket of two adults and two children. Children under 3 go free.

## SCHEDULE - 23rd June 2024

- 9:30am
  - The Car Park opens and the shuttle buses begin to run.
  - The canal boats and steam engines are open to the public.
  
- 10:30am
  - The Parade begins through the village.
  
- 11am
  - The parade terminates at the May Queen Field.
  - The May Queen Field opens to the public.
  - Maple Lodge opens, which is host to a fantastic Lego display.
  - The Village Hall opens, with a model railway display.
  
- 4pm
  - The canal boats have a sail past.
  
- 5pm
  - The event ends and venues close.
  - The shuttle buses stop running.

## LOCATIONS

Each of these locations below has a ticket station where you can buy your ticket. One ticket gets you into all locations.

### The May Queen Field - WA13 0JA

This is our main location, an open field where you'll find 400+ classic cars, vintage bicycles and live music, along with all manner of food and shopping stalls and attractions. You can access the field via Pepper Street, Mayfield View or Longbutt Lane. Each of these entry points have ticket stations where you can purchase your tickets. There is NO parking on the field for visitors.

### Maple Lodge - WA13 0JG

Next door to the May Queen Field you'll find the scout hut, Maple Lodge. Here we've got two halls of excellent Lego displays, along with a 'free play' room as well. Access is up the drive from Pepper Street. Please note, there is no parking at Maple Lodge for visitors.

Village Hall - WA13 0JB

On Pepper Street you'll find the Village Hall, in which we've got a fantastic model railway display and a model railway shop. Tickets available on the door.

Canalside & Henry Street Car Park - WA13 0LS

The boats will be moored up along the canal in Lymm, and overlooking the canal is the Henry Street Car Park, where you'll find the steam engines.

Lymm Heritage Centre - WA13 0DA

Here you'll find a full exhibition on the history of Historic Transport Day! Charting the last ten years of fantastic events.

The Community Centre - WA13 0DA

Just opposite the Heritage Centre, you'll find the Community Centre, where there'll be an artisan market.

\*There is a first aid station on the May Queen Field and another at the Community Centre. For our map of the village, please see below.
